From the desk of Pastor Niles

Discipleship at the Foot of the Mountain

And Peter said to Jesus, “Lord, it is good that we are here. If you wish, I will make three tents here, one for you and one for Moses and one for Elijah.” He was still speaking when, behold, a bright cloud overshadowed them, and a voice from the cloud said, “This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to him.”

In Matthew 17:1–9, Jesus takes Peter, James, and John up a high mountain. There, before their eyes, He is transfigured—His face shining like the sun, His clothes dazzling white. Moses and Elijah appear, representing the Law and the Prophets, and they speak with Jesus. It is a breathtaking moment, a glimpse of Christ’s divine glory usually hidden beneath His humility. Peter, overwhelmed, wants to capture the moment. “Lord, it is good that we are here,” he says, offering to build three tents. But before he can finish his plan, a bright cloud overshadows them, and the voice of the Father speaks: *“This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased; listen to Him.”*

Those words lie at the heart of Christian discipleship.

Discipleship is not first about doing impressive things for God, preserving spiritual “mountaintop experiences,” or following our own well-intentioned ideas. It begins—and continues—with listening to Jesus. The Father directs our attention away from ourselves and fixes it squarely on His Son. *Listen to Him.* Hear His Word. Trust His promises. Hold fast to what He says, even when it leads down the mountain and into the ordinary or difficult paths of life.

Notice what happens next. The disciples fall on their faces in fear. Glory rightly humbles sinners. Yet Jesus comes to them, touches them, and says, “Rise, and have no fear.” When they lift their eyes, they see no one but Jesus only. Moses and Elijah are gone; the cloud has lifted. What remains is Christ—enough for faith, enough for salvation.


So it is for us. God does not call us to chase glory, but to cling to Christ as He gives Himself to us in His Word and Sacraments. Discipleship means hearing that Word again and again: the Law that exposes our sin, and the Gospel that forgives it. It means holding to that Word when it comforts us—and when it challenges us. It means trusting that Jesus knows the way, even when that way leads to the cross.

At the end of this passage, Jesus leads the disciples back down the mountain. Life continues. Suffering still awaits. But they do not go alone, and neither do we. We go with Christ, who has revealed His glory not only on the mountain, but most fully on the cross and in the empty tomb.

As a congregation, our life together as disciples is shaped by this simple, profound calling: to listen to Jesus. When we gather around Scripture, when we receive the Lord’s Supper, when we teach our children, serve our neighbors, and encourage one another, we are being formed by His Word. The Father’s command still rings out for us today: *“This is my beloved Son...listen to Him.”*

May God grant us ears to hear and hearts that hold fast to His Word until we see our Lord in glory once again.
